

RE at Frettenham

RE at Frettenham is taught in accordance with the Norfolk Agreed Syllabus.

Our aim is to enable our students to hold balanced and informed conversations about religions and worldviews. Knowledge and skills specific to RE are planned and developed through Reception to year 6 in-line with the Age Related Expectations set out in the Agreed Syllabus.

RE is taught units, using an Inquiry based approach.

For each unit of work, children investigate a key concept of the religion being studied. The syllabus is structured to offer three distinct but related 'lenses' through which to view a topic: Theology, Philosophy and Human/Social Science.

Children in KS1 study Christianity and Judaism. Children in KS2 study Christianity and other world religions.

Resources used include *Understanding Christianity*, units of study published by the Diocese of Norwich, and online resources such as RE Quest, BBC Bitesize. Our curriculum is further enriched by visitors representing Christianity and other religions, and by visits to places of worship within Norfolk.
