Making Instruments

A kazoo is a simple wind instrument that allows the player to create sound by humming. Make your own kazoo. Hum a tune into the open end of the kazoo. What happens to the kazoo? What happens to the sound of your voice? Ask someone to guess the song!

Composition is one of the most creative musical activities. Select a topic of your choice and write a rap. Try to follow a rhyming pattern such as ABBA and AABB. Share your written rap or – even better – why not perform it on Seesaw?
