Dear parents and carers,

I hope you are keeping well and enjoyed the nice weather of the Easter Bank Holiday weekend.

Across the Harnser schools, we have worked to create a weekly template for Home Learning during the continued lockdown situation we face ourselves in. Attached to this email, you will see a class plan for each class that sets out work to be completed over the course of the week.

Each class has the following expectations:

### Daily Activities:

\* Numbots (EYFS and KS1) or Times Tables Rockstars (KS2)

At least one Sound Check to be completed each week

\* At least 20 minutes of reading – Class Teachers in Ducklings, Robins and Barn Owls will be reading a daily book to the children and will set questions for discussion based on this reading. In Kingfishers, this reading takes place on [www.ReadTheory.org](http://www.ReadTheory.org). Please ensure children are logging in to keep track of progress.

\* Daily spelling practise of a set rule using [www.SpellingFrame.co.uk](http://www.SpellingFrame.co.uk). Teachers will upload a spelling test on Fridays via Seesaw for the children to listen and respond to.

### Weekly Activities:

Across the week, in a way that suits your home set-up, the following will be set for completion:

\* 3x Maths-based activities, some online and some to be completed on paper

\* 3x writing activities, using a common stimulus from Pobble 365.com

\* 1/2x Science-based activity

\* 2x 'Keeping Active' activities

\* 3x Enrichment activities

\* 3x Project activities

\* 2x Guided Reading activities (Kingfishers only)

These activities could be shared across the week with 2-4 activities completed each day, in addition to the Daily Activities set out above.

Each week, we will send information about a whole-school project, with activities suited to the age of your children. This will allow some cross-class work if you have children in different classes and should allow collaboration and family discussion. This week, the project title is: All About Me.

I'd finally ask that you have logged on to Seesaw via the children's home-learning codes as this is where the online activities will be and where teachers will be uploading stories and where we'd like you to share the work you're doing at home.

If you need to be reminded of your child's login information for any online learning, please contact your class teacher on Seesaw or Tapestry. In addition, there are a variety of resources that you can access on the school's website.

We do, of course, appreciate that this isn't always easy and ask that you do as much as you can. Thank you for your support during this time – we have received some kind and heartfelt communication over the past month!
