Welcome back to the new school year. I hope you all had a great summer holiday and you're ready for the year ahead. Attached to this letter is the curriculum overview for the coming term. We have lots of exciting things planned for the coming term and on into the school year of 2019-20.



I will be setting up a 'Seesaw' account for each child. 'Seesaw' is a digital platform where we can post all the great things we are getting up to in school. You will be able to access this from home and see picture and information about our school day as well as other correspondence.

This term, PE will take place on Tuesdays and Fridays. Children will need the correct PE kit (white top, black/navy shorts and plimsols/outdoor trainers) and any children with long hair will need to ensure they have hairbands to tie their hair back. In addition, children wearing earrings will be required to take these out and store them safely in the classroom.

It is very important to be reading at home every day for at least 10 minutes. I will send home a reading book and advice on reading with your child. Please keep a record of when your child has read in their reading diary.

As a general rule, homework will be given on a Friday and is expected the following Tuesday. There will also be fun holiday homework which will be topic based.

Every child has access to 'Sumdog', this is a fantastic program full of games for practicing and inquiring maths skills. I will often set challenges and competitions to be completed at home in return for rewards.
