Impact of Pupil Premium Grant spending 2015/16

1 child did not achieve GLD in EYFS.

66% of Year 2 PP children achieved expected in reading and maths in Key Stage 1 Assessments.

33% of Year 2 PP children achieved expected in writing in Key Stage 1 Assessments.

NO PP children took Key Stage 2 Assessments in the 2016/16 year.

Regular pupil tracking and progress discussion with teachers enables the SMT to intervene at the earliest possible time and match pupils' needs with specific provisions. These are reviewed with the intention that any gaps in achievement are closed and the Pupil Premium Grant is one of the reasons. The Pupil Premium Grant also allowed the school to offer a range of curriculum enrichment activities, which proved successful in developing children's confidence, and in boosting self-esteem.
