| £1500 | Maintenance and insurance of minibuses.<br>Employment of driver   | Competitions and festivals have restarted. Having transport enables more pupils to access more events. An employed driver enables a greater number of staff, not qualified to drive, to accompany children to fixtures and sporting events thus raising the whole school profile of physical education. It also avoids funding supply cover. | Pupils across the school have accessed sporting events and competitions. These include Nebula events in a variety of sports and local association athletics competition at a bespoke, multi-disciplinary athletics venue.  |
| £1290 | Purchase of equipment for the new building which will be used for dance, gymnastics and other forms of physical activity.<br>(Mats/benches) | This means that many aspects of the physical education curriculum will be taught on site.  | Delays to the building have reduced the impact although mats were purchased and used in an alternative space. This enhanced the ability to teach gymnastics.   |
| £3200 | Pupils will continue to participate in local leagues and Nebula competitions and festivals.   | The variety of competition/festival available ensures that a high percentage of children can access inter-school events.   | During the course of the year pupils in year groups 1 – 6 have accessed competitions in multi-sports; rugby; cricket; athletics; cross country. Apart from the physical benefits, children learn to win with humility and lose with grace, learning from the experience. They also begin to understand the enjoyment and |

| £2800 | Contribution to a new mobile sensory space to be available to Hainford   | Pupils will have access to a sensory space at Hainford, fully equipped with a bespoke sensory unit to aid sensory processing and sensory integration. This enables pupils with physical, sensory needs to access the broader curriculum, improving their learning outcomes. | Pupils who struggle with transitions or who have sensory needs benefit from having access to a facility which offers them space and a calming environment. These pupils are able to more easily access the broader curriculum as they are 'ready' to learn.             |
| £90   | Affiliations to local associations   | Access to football, cross country and athletic competition for pupils who would not otherwise be able to compete against other schools.   | This has enabled pupils to take part in competition and staff to become part of the local network.  |
| £1109 | Purchase of sensory circuit equipment  | Pupils have access to daily sensory circuits. This enables them to regulate and manage transitions, impacting their ability to access the broader curriculum.   | Pupils struggling to settle in the morning were able engage in purposeful, physical activity enabling them to transition calmly into the classroom. At the end of the day pupils had the opportunity to 'burn off' excess energy before moving to the home environment. |
| £7000 | Specialist physical education teacher employed to engage and motivate children and upskill other staff               | More pupils will have access to high quality physical education, their skill levels will increase and they will be able to apply the skills learnt. Non-specialist staff will benefit from high quality CPD.  | Pupils with access to high quality physical education teaching have made significant progress in skill acquisition and engagement with physical activity. They know more and remember more.   |
| £440  | Purchase of new equipment to broaden the physical education offer and increase the level of activity at lunchtime by | Pupil skills will develop more rapidly when they are motivated through access to equipment. Fitness levels will improve.  | Equipment purchased has enhanced the curriculum offer and enabled pupils to partake in more active lunch times.   |

| £2,120 | Employment of a specialist, physical education teacher to raise standards and up-skill other members of staff.  | Pupils who receive high quality physical education lessons make faster progress in skill acquisition, are more successful in transferring their skills and are more likely to enjoy physical activity.  |
| £1,000 | Maintenance of mini bus and associated costs.   | Competitions and festivals are scheduled for the year. Having transport enables more pupils to access more events. Children attending fixtures and sporting events raise the whole school profile of physical education. The mini bus, in conjunction with other Nebula buses, enables a class of children to go to another school to access gymnastic equipment. |
| £200   | Attendance at all available adapted games events organised through the SSP.<br><i>Costs are related to transport and staff cover.</i>   | Pupils with SEND benefit hugely in participating in adapted sports/games, primarily in areas of self-esteem, enjoyment, courage.  |
| £600   | Pupils will continue to compete in SSP arranged competition; local leagues and, increasingly, in Nebula competitions and festivals as the partnership with the Community Sports Foundation develops.<br><i>Costs are related to subscriptions; transport; supply costs covering attending staff; hiring of venue and provision of referees/coaches.</i> | We aim to increase the participation of our pupils in regular competition year on year. Offering a range of events which include coaching followed by coached matches; Nebula inter-school competition and league and district leagues, we aim to involve all levels of ability and experience.   |

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| £80    | Affiliation fees for local associations | Access to football, cross country and athletic competition for pupils who would not otherwise be able to compete against other schools  |
| £6180  | Employment of midday supervisory staff. | Staff will facilitate active play for all children and organise structured activities to motivate and challenge pupils.   |
| £80    | Dance taster for all pupils             | Introducing children to Hip Hop with links to local class availability intends to inspire them to dance beyond the curriculum.  |
| £6,360 | Purchase of gymnastics apparatus.       | To further enhance the gymnastic skills of all pupils by giving them the opportunity to climb, slide etc. without the need to travel to other sites. This also lengthens the learning time. |
