This making us consider how we live our lives as consumers, we are compassionate for the lives that we impact, thus making us realise that we have a responsibility towards others, even if we don't know them and can't see them. This can also help the children foster their skills of forgiveness, considering how we need to care for our planet to make amends for the mistakes of others.
