Balance B/F £4120	Contribution to new Federation minibus purchased 19.11.20 (Total cost £19,300)	Competitions and festivals will restart as soon as government guidelines permit. Having transport enables more pupils to access more events. An employed driver enables a greater number of staff, not qualified to drive, to accompany children to fixtures and sporting events thus raising the whole school profile of physical education.	Pupils across the school and of all abilities have accessed competition and festivals. Nebula events include multi-skills; tag-rugby; cross country and cricket. NPSAA cross country was also accessed.
£2000	Maintenance and insurance of minibuses. Employment of driver	Pupils will be able to access events and competitions locally, more cost effectively than hiring coaches.	Pupils took part in, and enjoyed, competitions and festivals.
£525	Basketball posts to maintain the range of opportunity.	Pupils will be able to access the equipment during lessons/play times/extra curricular activities. The posts purchased can be adjusted to differing heights allowing all pupils access.	Pupils have an extended curriculum offer and the opportunity to practise their skills at lunchtimes.
£614	Purchase of table tennis table	Increases the range of activity available and improves activity levels during lunchtimes	Pupils have learnt new skills and they are more active during the lunchtime break.
£1500	Pupils will continue to compete in SSP arranged competition; local leagues and, increasingly, in Nebula competitions and festivals as the partnership with the Community Sports Foundation develops and a new local venue becomes available.	A broad selection of pupils will access sporting events and competition. As the events are repeated annually more pupils will have the opportunity to take part; represent their school, aspire to excellence; learn to lose and win – increase resilience	These events did not restart until later in the year. However, pupils from both key stages have taken part in competition and <i>all</i> pupils took part in a virtual competition when coaches went into schools.

£4314	Employment of a P.E. Apprentice	Assistance with preparing/sanitising equipment for lessons increases the actual teaching time available. Active lunchtimes will be facilitated through organised physical activity and after school fitness clubs will run within government guidelines.	Pupils have had access to an additional adult during curriculum time; this has enabled greater focus on individual skills. Pupils have been able to access structured activity during lunchtimes, increasing activity level and improving behaviour.
£500	Support for pupils in Yr.6 attending a residential course in kayaking, canoeing and orienteering.	Pupils accessing high levels of challenge, personal and skill, across new activities. Raised self-esteem, aspiration, self-awareness, ability to work as part of a team and self-confidence.	Due to the pandemic this trip did not take place. Funds have been carried forward.
£1099	Purchase of equipment	Table tennis table to encourage active lunchtimes. Purchase of lacrosse equipment to increase the range of activity offered. This is a sport that all children will access at the same entry level and there will be opportunity at a later date to compete with other schools in the federation as all schools have purchased lacrosse equipment	Pupils have enjoyed learning new skills; it has been particularly inclusive as no pupil had prior experience of lacrosse and the skills involved are unique to the game.
£8,000	Specialist physical education staff will teach pupils and provide staff with professional development, mentoring and resources. <i>Costs are related to employment costs.</i>	Standards in the teaching of physical education will continue to rise and pupils' skill level, participation and enjoyment will increase. The sustainability is self-evident when increasing numbers of staff have the opportunity to work alongside specialists.	Pupils and staff have benefited from specialist teaching at KS1 and KS2. There is clear progression of skills, knowledge and understanding.

£1500	Maintenance and insurance of minibuses. Employment of driver	Competitions and festivals have restarted. Having transport enables more pupils to access more events. An employed driver enables a greater number of staff, not qualified to drive, to accompany children to fixtures and sporting events thus raising the whole school profile of physical education. It also avoids supply teacher funding.
£1121	Purchase of sensory circuit equipment	Pupils have access to daily sensory circuits. This enables them to regulate and manage transitions, impacting their ability to access the broader curriculum.
£3200	Pupils will continue to compete in SSP arranged competition; local leagues and, increasingly, in Nebula competitions and festivals as the partnership with the Community Sports Foundation develops. <i>Costs are related to subscriptions; transport; purchase of Nebula trophies; supply costs covering attending staff; hiring of venue and provision of referees/coaches.</i>	We aim to increase the participation of our pupils in regular competition by 50%., including cross country.
£4000	Specialist physical education teacher employed to engage	More pupils will have access to high quality physical education, their skill levels

	and motivate children and upskill other staff	will increase and they will be able to apply the skills learnt. Non-specialist staff and the PE apprentice will benefit from high quality CPD.
£8 808	Continued engagement of a PE apprentice. This provides support to staff teaching physical education and structured activity at lunchtimes. Apprentices have also been trained to run sensory circuits. <i>Cost is a proportion of salary reflecting contribution towards physical education.</i>	Pupils in lessons will have more individual support; they will have young role models; behaviours at lunchtimes will be positive and pupils will be more active. Sensory circuits can be run at various times during the day, meeting the needs of more children.
£90	Affiliations to local associations	Access to football, cross country and athletic competition for pupils who would not otherwise be able to compete against other schools.
