Project – All About Me

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to learn more about the area in which they live. Learning may focus on your local area, famous people, key landmarks and links to your village.

To develop knowledge of the Let's Create: location of significant places:

Ask your child to look at where they live. What can they see outside the window in the front of their house? At the back of their house? What could they find near them? Find a map and see if they can find Hainford or where you live. Do they know the name of their street? Can they create a street sign with their street name?

Compass: Make a compass. Do you know what the different compass points mean? Can you label the points?

Could you create a flag for Hainford or where you live? What colours represent the area? Would you include an animal?

Reflect:

Think about what would improve their local area? What is their local area lacking? What spoils their local area? What could be done?

This half-term's maths challenge

Learn to tell the time: Telling the time can be a difficult skill to learn, especially when having to read clocks with hands (analogue).
