## Inquiry-based learning

We are adopting an inquiry-based learning approach to teaching and learning. It starts by posing a scenario, which creates a range of questions, problems and tasks that the children investigate across different subjects. For example, Class 3 have been given the scenario of building a dinosaur park in Norfolk.
