Thank you so much to all the parents of our Ducklings and Robins children who came in on Thursday before half term to celebrate our 100<sup>th</sup> day of school. It was great to see so many adults getting involved with everything from 100 kisses to 100 star-jumps! The children worked hard counting a variety of 100 objects during the day too.

#### **Primary Stars**

Last half term, children from Barn Owls and Kingfishers participated in the Premier League Primary Stars scheme with Jake Mardell from the Community Sports Foundation. Using football as a focus, one group worked on their resilience and co-operation skills in a PSHE workshop while a second group worked together on a variety of Maths activities using football statistics and other sports-based data. The children worked incredibly hard and got a lot out of the sessions. Well done and thanks to Jake for all his hard work!

#### Assertive Mentoring
