### Whole-School Transition Morning

We also had the opportunity to welcome Miss L Gower to Hainford Primary school as class 1's new teacher for September. Transition activities and preparations will continue to run in conjunction with our end-of-year events, in which promises to be a busy and enjoyable final three weeks.

### Sports Day – Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> July

Given the length of time that has passed since our last proper sports day, meaning that many of our families have not had the opportunity to experience one, I thought that it would be best to outline the afternoon.

Pupils should come to school dressed in PE kit but wearing a T-Shirt/top that matches their house team colour so red, green, yellow or blue. If you are unsure which house team your child is in, please contact the school office or your child's class teacher. If your child doesn't have a suitable top, then we have coloured bibs that can be worn over your child's PE kit.

Parents / carers plus wider family members are all welcome to attend the family picnic and sports day. The gates used for pick-up and drop-off will be opened between 11:55 and 12:10 and you can make your way to the school field where there will be areas marked by cones in which you can sit. If you arrive after this time, please report to the school reception. As per our risk assessments, smoking and vaping are not permitted on site and we of course can't have any dogs either – please also refrain from bringing any alcohol. Please ensure that you don't sit in other locations as these are needed either for events or for the children to sit. If you could also make sure that any younger children don't play with the PE equipment that will have been set-up on the running track then that would be greatly appreciated.

Pupils will then come out class by class and you can share lunch with them if you are able to attend. If not, children will sit and enjoy lunch outside together with staff. Once children have finished eating, then they can play in the rest of the field.

From 12:55, the school bell will be rung and all children will need to line-up as usual ready for registration. Sports day will start at 1:15pm when the children will parade outside in their house teams and then sit down in their allocated areas. Children will then participate in a wide range of events so please encourage and support all pupils. Again please ensure that young children don't run onto the track during the events.

Hainford PTA will be selling refreshments and running a tombola during the afternoon to raise money for the school so please show your support and help raise money for the school.

Sports day will finish at approximately 2:50pm when the winning house team will be announced. We will then take all children back to class and dismiss as usual at 3pm.

### City Sports




