Children's University



Children's University have made the decision that only children graduating at gold level will now be able to attend an official graduation ceremony. This decision was taken, as they felt that some children could graduate at every single level, meaning there were some children graduating up to 30 times, which was thought to be too much. They felt that children would likely look forward to the ceremonies more and feel like it is more of an achievement, if they just graduate at the top level of each certificate band, e.g. gold.



Therefore from now on, only children who have achieved enough hours to get gold certificate will be attending an official CU graduation.

In response to this decision, the Nebula Federation of schools will be looking into holding their own graduation ceremony for those children who have achieved a bronze or silver award during the Autumn Term.
