Welcome Back and Thanks

I'd like to offer a warm welcome back to Elm Class, who are re-joining us after their isolation period. In addition, a big 'thank you' to those of you who sent kind messages during isolation and school closure. Our staff here at St Faiths' have worked incredibly hard this year and it's great to be able to share the recognition with them.

December is here!

As we head into December, please can I remind you about social distancing and ensuring the children are sent to school in appropriate school uniform. It might start getting colder in the classrooms as we have windows open for ventilation so a vest or extra t-shirt might be good!

Office Contact

Please could I remind all parents of the social distancing rules that are in place. Even as we head out of lockdown and into Tier 2, household bubbles should not be mixing – and this includes at the school gate. To maintain hygiene, please could I ask that you refrain from coming to the office unless in an emergency and direct all contact with Sarah via telephone or email.

What is self-isolation?

When a 'bubble' closes at St Faiths', it means there is a chance your child has been in contact with a positive Covid case. We ask that your child self-isolates for 14 days, as instructed by the NHS and UK Government. This means your child ***should not leave the house*** for 14 days.

Home Learning

For those children learning from home, work will be uploaded to Tapestry (Reception and Year 1) and Teams (Years 2-6). Our teachers are going above and beyond to ensure the work is suitable and accessible to all and this means most pieces can be completed on paper. Please ensure you support the school by encouraging your child to complete their work and help them to upload it to Teams.
