Power of Reading

To kick-start the new school year, we have been involved in a Nebula Reading Week. Across the school, the children have completed a range of tasks and activities based on Tin Forest by Helen Ward and The Promise by Nicola Davies. Both texts fit in with our Christian value of Responsibility as they are about looking after the environment and being responsible for our actions.

In Ducklings the children shared the story of Tin Forest as a class. They worked hard on their listening skills and enjoyed a different type of picture book. After they shared the story, the children thought about the animals that they might find in a tin forest.

In Robins the children enjoyed exploring language to describe the differences between the animals in the Tin Forest and a real forest. They've created a lovely classroom display of their artwork, comparing the two landscapes.

Using The Promise, children in Barn Owls also wrote a range of descriptive sentences. Using the story and the book illustrations, the children thought about the message the book gave — that we should look after the environment.

Children in Kingfishers didn't participate in this Reading Week as our rehearsals for A Midsummer Night's Dream are well underway. We are excited to be heading to the Norwich Playhouse on Wednesday (25th) for our first on-stage rehearsal.

Nelson's Journey
