<u>Homework - Microsoft Teams</u>

Because of current Covid restrictions, we are trying to keep homework as simple as possible. Following some feedback from parents, children in Years 2 – 6 will this week receive a Maths workbook and a comprehension book for homework. Inside is a letter explaining the use of Microsoft Teams for our remote learning. This is in line with other Nebula schools. I appreciate this is another change we are making but in the long run, it will benefit everyone. Homework will be set each week and will be set on a Friday, due in the following Wednesday.

This week, I'll be working with groups of children to show them how to use Microsoft Teams and they will all be bringing a login home, which you can find glued on the front of their homework book. There will also be an accompanying letter and some online videos to help.

Collective Worship

At present we are unable to hold our daily collective worship assemblies all together in the school hall. Because of this, we have restructured collective worship to be class-based and each day has a different theme:

Monday – Join with John – Our new Foundation Governor, John Hindley, has very kindly been providing an online assembly each week to coincide with our Christian values. Tuesday – **Newsday Tuesday** – You can't escape Coronavirus on the news at the moment but through these Tuesday sessions, we are sharing a variety of other news stories from around the world.

Wednesday – Wellbeing Wednesday – Each week, we meet a new character to help equip us with skills and tools to promote positive physical and mental health. We've so far met Roger the Routine Rooster and Sienna the Serene Swan and have talks through tactics for a good night's sleep and what to do with our worries.

Thursday – Thoughtful Thursday – Using resources from The Philosophy Man, we share 'big questions' in class and hold a discussion about our thoughts and opinions. The adults in class challenge or thoughts to help us delve deeper into our beliefs while thinking about the beliefs of others. If you'd like to do something similar at home, why not consider this question from our learning this week: Would it be good if people could fly?

Friday – Celebration Assembly – My favourite collective worship of the week! Each class selects a child (or two!) for their great work during the week and I get to present their certificate virtually, using Microsoft Teams. It's also a nice chance for all the children to see each other as we can't mix between bubbles! Children who receive certificates will bring them home as the certificates have been kept in isolation before they are presented.

Parent Pay

You will have received your letter for our new online payment service, Parent Pay, last week. It's a great online platform that will allow payments to be made wirelessly, not only for school dinners but also for such a time that trips take place or monies are needed to pay for after-school clubs. Even if your child is in receipt of Universal Free School meals, we ask that you sign up to Parent Pay for these other possible financial exchanges. If you aren't sure how to do this, please contact Sarah in the office.

Book Return

If your child borrowed any books from school over lockdown (or before) that haven't yet been returned, please bring them back to school this week. We'll have a box in the corridor to put these in so they can be quarantined before we return them to the library for others to enjoy. Thank you.

Special Lunch – Thurs 1st Oct

Norse are providing a special school lunch on Thursday next week. All children in receipt of Universal Free School Meals will be ordered this lunch as a way of showing some of the food available. If you still wish to send in a packed lunch from home, please do.

Parental Guidance (PG) Films






Attendance
