I'd like to extend a warm welcome to all our new Reception children and the new children we have throughout our school. They're fitting in well to life at St Faiths', making lots of friends already. In addition, I'd like to extend a warm welcome to Miss Jessica Newton, who will be completing her PE Apprenticeship with us this year. I know she'll feel welcome by our lovely children and fit in well.

Weather-Appropriate Clothing

As we aim to keep classrooms ventilated, it might be prudent to send your child with at least their jumper or cardigan every day. School fleeces are also available from our uniform stockists and could be worn in the classroom. As always, please ensure all clothing is clearly named.

Here We Are

Last year we started to use the Power of Reading programme to structure our English and Literacy lessons using good, quality texts. This year is no exception and the whole-school began the transition back into school with Here We Are by Oliver Jeffers. Through letterwriting, poetry and thinking of others, the children have produced some lovely pieces and each class has created a unique class display in the corridor. These can be seen on Seesaw and Tapestry.

SeeSaw and Tapestry

As with last year, all classes have signed up to use SeeSaw this year. As you will have seen from lockdown, it's an excellent tool that allows regular and easy communication, as well as interactive activities. Mrs Landles has spoken to Elm Class parents about using Tapestry to share your children's work; please ensure you sign up. We'll use it to upload photos and messages regularly, including homework and spellings which will need to be completed online. Those with children in Chestnut, Oak or Willow class will have had an email with their respective access codes from Sarah. If you haven't, please contact the office.

Reading

One skill that underpins all learning is the ability to read. We will be issuing children reading books that can be taken between home and school, accompanied by a Reading Record Journal to help keep track of the reading you do at home. Please rest-assured any books sent home will be quarantined for at least 72 hours after use and Reading Record Journals will be checked once a week. We ask that they are brought into school every day to ensure regular home/school communication.

Please ensure you read with your children regularly or — if they read independently — hold discussions about what they are reading. No child is 'too old' to be read to either! Children will receive merits for their reading at home. We recommend at least:

Elm Class – 10 minutes shared reading daily Chestnut Class – 15 minutes shared reading daily

Oak and Willow Class – 20 minutes reading daily

Reading doesn't have to be a traditional novel or a school reading book. It could be game instructions, articles, magazines, comics or even the TV guide!

Please ensure you upload a photo to Tapestry/Seesaw of your weekly reading record to show your class teacher how much reading you're doing at home. This could be on a Friday/Monday for the previous week.

ParentPay

Yesterday you received a letter about our new cashless payment system — ParentPay. By using this online system, we'll be able to manage all school payments through one platform. Please try logging in and playing around with the system. If you need any support, contact Sarah in the office.

Homework

On Monday children will bring home their reading records and a reading book. Along with these, you'll find your child's login information for TTRockstars, Numbots and Seesaw. In Chestnut, Oak and Willow classes, homework and spellings will be set on a **Friday**. A letter with more information will go home on Monday with the reading records.

Food Parcels

We have been working alongside the Soul Church to ensure everyone has access to necessary food during, and after, lockdown. I know lots of families have been incredibly grateful for this additional support; in fact, over 100 Nebula families have been supported over the last 20 weeks! I'd like to extend an additional and special thanks to Jenni, our Executive Deputy, and Natalie, our Pastoral Care manager, who have both tirelessly managed the delivery of food parcels across our 6 Nebula schools, along with a team of staff volunteers, all through the summer. Thank you!
