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

In many ways, the school closures have brought a set of unique and un-faced challenges for so many of us – for those still providing face to face care for many children of critical workers, for teachers leading learning in new remote ways, for pupils having to work out their new identities (particularly those Year 6, 11 and 13 pupils for whom things have radically and rapidly changed), for families beginning a new phase of life and for parents working from home, whilst providing care and also home-learning – there has never been anything like it in peacetime.



It is difficult to imagine a time when we have faced such uncertain times and we have had to take so many decisions, often very quickly and without the necessary guidance being completely in place.

Free School Meals

Our school offices have been extremely busy collating email addresses of those parents in receipt of Free School Meals to enable them to order the FSM vouchers offered by the government in their recent announcements. Despite the hard work and fortitude of our office staff, it has become increasingly apparent that the system in place is not sufficient to cope with the unprecedented demand by schools all over the country. The online ordering system is not accepting the orders for vouchers and this has been the case for the vast majority of schools. We have had to send numerous emails to try to get the help necessary to place our voucher orders. All to no avail.

Once our orders are accepted all parents who have provided a current email address will get an email with an e-code and we will update you once we have more information. Please do not contact us with queries about the vouchers, because as explained we have absolutely no answers yet. Thank you for your patience and understanding regarding this matter.
