### The 'Value for Life' this half-term is: Respect and Reverence

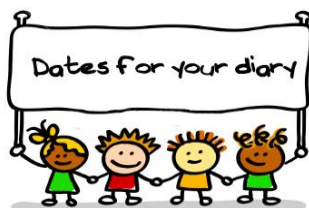
A Christian Perspective on Respect and Reverence:
