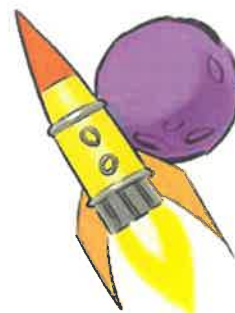

Summer Reading Challenge 2019



This week in assembly I introduced the libraries Summer Reading Challenge. I was rather disappointed that lots of children said they were not members of the library or visited the local libraries. Please try and get involved and support our library service, they are under a lot of pressure to make saving and if the demand for the service is not there then it is an easy area to squeeze financially.

This year's Reading Challenge asks the children to join the Super Space Family – The Rockets for a thrilling mission to track down their missing books which have been nabbed by mischievous aliens.

The challenge asks the children to read at least six books (fiction, fact books, joke books, picture books and even audio books) over the summer. Audio books are a great for long holiday journeys. When children sign up they will receive a folder with all the information they need and as they read their books they will get stickers to collect. They can order in books they would like to read... and return books to any Norfolk library.

When they complete the challenge they will receive a certificate and also we will celebrate it at school in assembly too.
