The <u>Solihull Approach</u> 'Understanding Your Child' is a free online course available for everyone who cares for children aged 0-18 years. It's there to help you recognise emotions in yourself and your child to see how they can impact on behaviour.

The course can help increase your confidence as a parent or carer so that difficulties encountered in everyday life are reduced by seeing a child's behaviour from their point of view. A closer relationship between you and your child can develop, resulting in a calmer and happier household for everyone.

Learning is split up into 6 sections:

- Labour, birth and your baby
- Understanding your baby
- Understanding your child
- Understanding your child with additional needs
- Understanding your teenager's brain
- Understanding your brain (for teenagers!)

As a school, we will be looking at how children show their respect for each other and adults in the school community. We will look at how children are encouraged to value and respect their own and other people's belongings and the wider environment.




