The 'Value for Life' for this half-term is Truthfulness

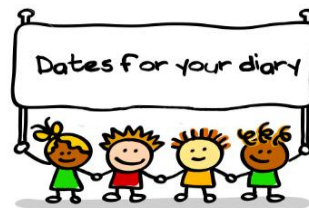
A Christian Perspective on Truthfulness:
