Assertive Mentoring (Parent's Evenings)

During these meetings you will be given an Assertive Mentoring report that will outline how your child is doing at school, targets that we will be working on in school and information on attendance, uniform and attitude.

Attendance

As you may be aware, because pupil's attendance at school is a legal requirement, schools are tasked with analysing their pupils' attendance throughout the year. When a pupil's attendance falls below 95%, schools are required to inform parents and support them in ensuring their child's attendance improves.

Illness

As we know all too well, returning to school after the summer holidays means children will be mixing with other children more regularly which often means they are likely to pick up coughs, colds etc. After our first half term at school, pupils who have had just 2 days off school due to illness will have already dropped below 95%.

Holiday

We are also aware that many families have chosen to take their child out of school during this first half term to go on holiday. Again, this has meant that many of our pupils' attendance has dropped below 95% and, for holidays of four days or more, to below 90%.



Attendance letters from school

We are conscious that receiving attendance letters from school can cause upset but want to reassure you that we have a legal obligation to monitor attendance and notify parents if their child's attendance is of concern. With all of the above in mind, at this point in the year, we are only writing to parents whose child's attendance has fallen below 90% and is not linked to being on holiday. If you do receive a letter and are concerned, please make contact with Mr Cross to discuss it further.

Punctuality Letters

Here at Hainford we also highly value the importance of punctuality. Our school day starts at 8.45am and being on time is very important. Arriving late at school can be very disruptive for your child, the teacher and the other children in the class. As with attendance letters, punctuality letters will also be sent out in order to inform parents/carers and support them in ensuring their child's punctuality improves.


