Harvest Festival

The church will be open from 8:30am to receive any items or alternatively food can be brought to the office on Thursday 7th or Friday 8th October.

Parents and carers will be invited to this celebration and further details will be sent out at the end of this week outlining our risk assessments.

School Council


Children across the school are taking part in elections during last and this week to create our school council. There will be seven representatives in total with three for class 3 and two each from classes 1 and 2. The school council will then meet roughly every two weeks to gather children's opinions and make decisions about issues such as play equipment, clubs and our school library. Those interested have been busy preparing their speeches and presentations ahead of class elections. Results will be published in next week's newsletter.

Our Collective Worship Theme: How do we Flourish Together? (The Climate Emergency)

On Tuesday, Reverend Engelsen lead our collective worship to launch our next topic in collective worship which is: "*How do we flourish together? Climate emergency*" We briefly explored what climate change is and how we can help within school.

"The climate emergency faced by us as a planet cannot be ignored: children are well aware of the impact that we as human beings have had – and are continuing to have – on our future. What is perhaps less emphasised is the reality that this is already having a greater impact on the majority world – and that, conversely, they are often leading the way in combatting climate change. However, we must also remember that rather than scare children with what might happen, we need to empower them to feel that even small actions can make a difference: who can fail to remember the impact that the global pandemic had on the waterways in Venice in a relatively short time, for example? Ahead of the G7 climate conference in Cornwall (11th-13th June), and the COP26 conference in Glasgow in November, these resources are designed to get school communities thinking, talking, praying and taking action!"

Please can you ensure that all clothing, especially jumpers and cardigans, are clearly labelled to ensure that they can be swiftly returned and not end up in the lost property box.


Individual and Sibling School photographs – New Date
